Team Philippines Crowned Overall Champion at FIA Asia Pacific Motorsports Championship 2025

Team Philippines captured the much-coveted Nation's Cup Trophy at the FIA Asia Pacific Motorsports Championship 2025 after hauling the most medals, thereby emerging as the top motor sport nation in the region.

The prestigious event, inaugurated in Malaysia in 2023, was held in Sri Lanka from September 26–28. This year's edition gathered over 210 competitors from 18 countries across six disciplines: karting, karting slalom, auto gymkhana, esports, and autocross where competitors welcomed the debut of the FIA Cross Car.

The 11-strong Filipino delegation, fielded by the Automobile Association of the Philippines (AAP), delivered exceptional performances across categories. With a total of six (6) medals—2 golds, 2 silvers, 2 bronzes—their collective victories propelled the Philippines to secure the overall championship trophy.

"The FIA has created this opportunity for grassroots level. I've seen and experienced a lot in the international motor sport scene as a race official, and I can say that Filipino drivers are competitive and talented enough—they just need the right opportunity and support," AAP Motor Sport head Rikki Dy-Liacco, who led the team in Sri Lanka, shared.

Dy-Liacco added, "Going into this event, I was confident of our driver line-up. I'm happy that through AAP's support, we were able to produce outstanding results."

"This is a milestone for Philippine motor sport," said Mandy Eduque, AAP Trustee and Motor Sport Committee Chair. "Our drivers have proven their skill and determination against the best in the region. This victory shows the potential of Filipino talent on the global stage. They've made the entire nation proud."
